

FOG TO HONOR SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA NATIVE COLLIN MORIKAWA

Friends of Golf (FOG) announced that Collin Morikawa will be the Honoree for the 42nd Annual FOG Charity Golf Tournament to be played Monday, October 3, 2022, at Bel-Air Country Club. Morikawa, who was born in Los Angeles and attended La Canada High School, has already found success on the PGA Tour since he graduated from UC/Berkley and finished as a runner-up for the Ben Hogan Trophy in 2018 and 2019.

In his brief PGA career, Morikawa already has five wins including a World Golf Championship victory and two major golf championships: the 2020 PGA Championship and the 2021 British Open. Morikawa had a brilliant amateur career, winning five times and spending three weeks as #1 on the World Golf Amateur Ranking. As a member of the 2021 Ryder Cup, he went 3-0-1 and finished tied for third in the 2020 Olympics. As of this writing the 25-year-old has earned over \$17 million and ranks third in the Official World Golf Rankings.

His travels then took him to Hawaii, Cincinnati, San Francisco, and NBC before landing at ABC for three decades. Along the way, Michaels has announced college basketball, minor and major league baseball, horse racing, boxing, NBA and NFL, college football, ice skating, and of course, hockey. He returned to NBC in 2006 to call Sunday Night Football.

RED RAIDER CAPTURES 2022 HOGAN TROPHY AWARD

Texas Tech's Ludvig Aberg, a native of Eslov, Sweden, captured the 2022 Ben Hogan Trophy Award becoming the first Red Raider to win the trophy. Each year, the college golfer who has the best combination of amateur and collegiate success is honored during a ceremony at Ben Hogan's home course, Ft. Worth's Colonial Country Club. The ceremony takes place during the PGA's stop in Ft. Worth and as is tradition, Aberg receives an exemption into next year's event.

Aberg has had a brilliant amateur career and ranks #2 on the World Amateur Golf Rankings. He averaged 70.03 in 11 collegiate events this year and won the Big 12 Individual Championship, Aberg was runner-up in the 2021 European Amateur and made the cut in the PGA Tour's 2021 Bermuda Championships. He is only the third European to win the trophy following Jon Rahm in 2015 and 2016 and Viktor Hovland in 2019. He's also the third Big 12 golfer to win the trophy in the last five years.

The Ben Hogan Trophy was initiated by FOG in 1990 and since 2002, the Hogan Trophy Foundation has awarded more than \$875.000 in scholarships. This year, the Foundation is making a \$10,000 donation to the University of the Southwest following the tragic bus accident that killed six golfers and a coach from the school's men's and women's teams.

STANFORD'S ALINE KRAUTER NAMED DINAH SHORE TROPHY WINNER

Aline Krauter was named the 2022 Dinah Shore Trophy winner, an award that not only recognizes collegiate success on the golf course, but also considers classroom proficiency and service to the young woman's community. Krauter, who is from Stuttgart, Germany, helped her Cardinal team win the recent NCAA Women's Golf Championship played at Scottsdale's Grayhawk Golf Club. This past year, her average round was 71.86 putting her among Stanford's all-time best for female golfers. Majoring in International Business Studies, she posted a grade point average of 3.62 and earned PAC 12 Honor Roll honors in both 2020 and 2021. Outside of the classroom and off the course, Krauter

is involved with Stanford's ABC Literacy Day to help low-income students improve their reading abilities and directs a children's summer golf camp at her German club.

In addition to her success as a Cardinal, Krauter won the 2020 R&A Women's Amateur Championship and has already participated in four LPGA major golf championships, two U.S. Women's Amateurs and the Augusta National Women's Amateur. The Dinah Shore Trophy is a joint effort between FOG, the LPGA and the Chevron Championships. As part of the award, the winner's program receives a \$10,000 donation

Unfortunately, I was unable to attend the Hogan Trophy award ceremonies this year due to a bad back incurred during my April visit to Augusta for The Masters. It was the first year the committee implemented the Eddie Merrins Trophy and made me the inaugural recipient. The trophy is a Waterford crystal with my image on it and will be awarded annually to an individual for career accomplishments and for giving back to the game of golf. I'm extremely honored by the acknowledgment as I am being inducted into 13 Halls of Fame. Everyone of them means a lot to me.

All three of this year's Hogan finalists came from the Southwest with Texas A & M, Oklahoma St. and Texas Tech represented. The winner was Texas Tech's Ludwig, a native of Sweden who will receive an exemption into next year's PGA tournament at Colonial. Our

This year's U.S. Open brought back a lot of memories. I was at The Country Club outside of Boston for the 1999 Ryder Cup when Justin Leonard made a 45-foot putt. Despite the celebration that included the players' wives rushing out on the green, Jose Maria Olazabal still had a putt to tie the hole. When he missed, Leonard went 1-up and was guaranteed a half which gave the U.S. team a 14 ½ to 13 ½ victory. I had a role in the event when the U.S. captain, Ben Crenshaw, asked me to use my celebrity contacts to line-up Celine Dion to sing. The thought was since she's Canadian, the entertainment would be neutral. Of course, The Country Club is also famous due to Francis Ouimet's famous 1913 U.S. Open upset. Ouimet, who lived across the street from the course, stunned the golf world by defeating the game's greatest, including two worldrenowned British golfers, Harry Vardon and Ted Ray, in an 18-hole playoff. The historical achievement was later documented by author, Mark Frost, in his book, The Greatest Game Ever Played. It was later made into a movie. A key part of the story was Ouimet's caddie, a 10-year-old Eddie Lowery.






Honoree this year is Collin Morikawa, who was very enthusiastic about being named FOG's 2022 Honoree. During his : career at Cal/Berkley, he twice finished as a Hogan Trophy runner-up. He lost to Doug Ghim in 2018 and Victor Hovland in 2019. He was also a Semi-finalist in 2017 when Maverick McNealy won.

Lowery, who later became a successful car dealer in San Francisco, had another link to author Frost. While attending an event celebrating Byron Nelson's 11 consecutive victories in 1945, I heard about a story of a match in 1956 that pitted two pros, Ben Hogan and Byron Nelson against two amateurs, Ken

· Venturi and Harvie Ward at Cypress Point. Lowery had been instrumental in arranging the event. I had helped Frost. who was also a writer on the TV show. Hill Street Blues and co-creator of Twin Peaks, with his first two books about golf, so I relayed the story to him. His writing skill turned the unknown event into a terrific 255-page book entitled, The Match. I highly recommend it to any fan of golf.

Al Michaels will be our Ken Venturi Spirit of Giving recipient this year. Al has had one of the greatest announcing careers of all time and has given a lot to the game of golf.
